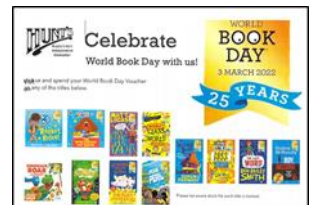

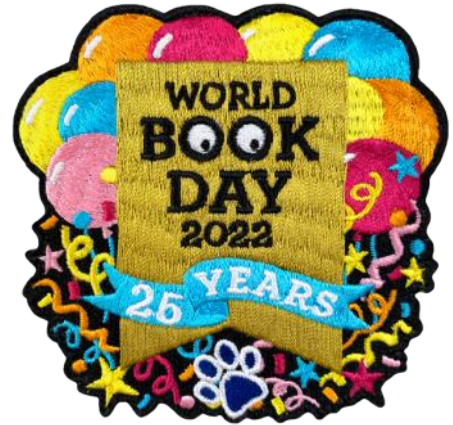
World Book Day 2022!
