Dear Parents and Carers,

I was sorry to hear the news this week about the Government's decision **not to** lift restrictions on the 21st of June. It has had a huge impact on our community and the activities we had planned for the end of term and transition. I'm sure you support my view that the safety of our children and families is our number one priority. The announcement has meant that some of events on the calendar have had to be cancelled. I am looking forward to the Autumn Term where, hopefully things will be back to normal.

I have been really lucky this week as I have been able to get into a lot of the classes and observe the learning that has taken place. In Year 3 I watched a lesson where the children had discovered items left by a giant that had been on site and were selecting appropriate vocabulary to describe him. In Year 4, I saw an outdoor lesson of data collection in maths where the children were applying their mathematical understanding to answering questions around the data they were using. In Year 5, I joined an online maths lesson where the children were working with angles and really confidently using their mathematical vocabulary. In Year 6 this week the adults have been very impressed with the mature approach and inquisitive questioning from the children in their RSE sessions.
