Whilst **the age limit to use WhatsApp is 16**, it remains a popular app amongst people of all ages. It uses **end-to-end encryption**, which means that only those with access to the phones of the sender and receiver can see the messages. This has caused multiple problems for agencies such as the police when dealing with incidents of cybercrime.

As default, any pictures sent via WhatsApp are saved to the recipient's phone, but with the release of their new **"View" Once"** messages, videos and images can be sent that can only be viewed once. These are not saved to the recipient's library.

Children are not permitted to use their phone during the school day and we encourage parents to be mindful of the age limits apps recommend. Parents are responsible for monitoring their child's use of technology outside of school, and whilst we are unable to support with any incidents of bullying or technology misuse that occur outside of school, we very much appreciate being informed of when this occurs.
